
WildSafeBC in the CRD



Source: Reports to COS and WARP in Cariboo region by species from January 1, 2016 to September 30, 2020.





Wildlife Conflict Update


- Increasing number of calls regarding human- wildlife conflicts
- 518 reports received between spring and October 28, 2020
 - On average 300 calls per year
 - Majority of calls for bears accessing non-natural food sources
- Spikes in conflict: Late April to May and late August to October
- A food- conditioned or human- habituated bear can present a heightened risk to public safety
