Mr. El hadji Mbaye M. DIAGNE is the Director General of **AFRIQUE – ENERGIE – ENVIRONNEMENT (AEE)** a consultancy firm in Senegal.

Mr. DIAGNE is an engineer, senior consultant and former President of the COMNACC (Senegalese National Board on Climate Change). He is member of the Senegalese official delegation for the UNFCCC negotiations since 2000 and he is the lead coordinator for market issues.

He supports many UNFCCC negotiating groups including the African Group of Negotiators (Lead Coordinator), the G77 & China (Lead Coordinator) and Least Developed Countries on issues related to "carbon markets" (KP mechanisms and Article 6 of the Paris Agreement).

M.DIAGNE is a Lead author for chapter 16, *Innovation, Technology development and transfer* of the IPCC Sixth Assessment Report (AR6).

M. DIAGNE coordinated the GHG inventories for the 2nd and 3rd National Communication of the republic of Senegal as well as the mitigation component of the Senegalese NDC under the Paris Agreement including the MRV component and potential carbon pricing.

He has a deep knowledge in Technology Transfer and Clean Development Mechanism under the Kyoto Protocol as well as the Voluntary Carbon Market and in development and implementation of policies in relation to climate change.

M. DIAGNE is member of the Clean Development Mechanism Executive Board (Chair in 2020) and chaired the Methodology Panel of the CDM. He his also member of many Working Groups set up by the World Bank on Carbon Market and Article 6 of the Paris Agreement; He joined also the Gold Standard's working group for the alignment of its rules with the Article 6 of the Paris Agreement.

Mbaye is also member of the Supervisory Board of the Article 6.4 of the Paris Agreement.

M. DIAGNE has conducted many studies in the West Africa region on carbon markets, climate finance and carbon pricing projects.

As director and lead consultant of AEE, he supports the West African Alliance on Carbon markets and Climate Finance and realized many trainings for government representatives and other stakeholders on topics related to carbon markets and climate finance.

M. DIAGNE is also member of RAG-CLIN, a core team set up by ECOWAS and funded by EU as carbon markets expert (Article 6 of the Paris Agreement) supporting the UNFCCC negotiators during the SBs and COP.

Mbaye works and performs trainings in both, French and English.
